This fourth annual Seminar saw 16 grief travelers participating in the two hour program. From our experience and pain from loss Debby and I shared how to find hope for the upcoming holidays. Special thanks to Dan Cooper for his support and promotion. Special thanks, as well, to Harriet Wensel who capably handled refreshments along with the help of Judi Campbell. I also appreciated the hard work of Bud Britton and Ray Wilson to get the room set up for the Seminar.

For those of you who have lost a loved one recently, I offer the following: First, take care of yourself physically. Grieving may be the hardest work you have ever done. It will take lots of energy. So, get adequate rest. Drink more water and less soda. Eat a properly balanced diet. Eating too many sweets or rich foods will make you feel even more lethargic. Second, let others help you. By allowing them to help you, you will be helping them to communicate their love for you. Give grace to people who don't know what to do or to say. Some will likely make hurtful statements which you will need to ignore. Third, lower your expectations. You don't have to do all the holidays, but do some. Simplify, don't abandon. Leave the word "ought" out of your holiday this year. Make lists, because when you are grieving, it is hard to concentrate.

Fourth, you will have to deal with your emotions. It is okay to feel sad. It is okay to cry, even weep. You are not going crazy. Tears are a natural cleansing and healing mechanism. Of course, some people may feel uncomfortable with your tears. Don't be surprised that your tears come when you least expect them. Don't be caught off guard by those "grief bursts." It is even okay to feel good, to laugh, and have fun. You are in no way being disrespectful to the memory of your loved one if you enjoy yourself at times. Finally, after awhile, you should be able to turn your attention to helping others. There are many possibilities that will bring many rewards to you.

Right now you may feel like the scattered pieces of a broken puzzle. Honor that feeling. But also take comfort in knowing the pieces of the puzzle can be reshuffled, rearranged, and pieced together to form a new picture.

Sign Thanksgiving Cards!



Family Promise Volunteers

Is 2016 the year that you will help with Family Promise? The next Host Week is January 17-January 24.

We are looking for new volunteers to join our many seasoned volunteers as we journey into our 3rd year of this important ministry. We need volunteers for the following jobs (a brief summary of responsibilities are included).

<u>Coordinator</u>: The Coordinator begins recruiting the volunteers for the Host week about 1 month before the start of the Host week. The Coordinator will be contacted by the Family Promise Director with the number of family members, a list of dietary requirements (if any), shopping list to restock the Center's pantry (a full list of responsibilities are available on request).

Shopper: The Shopper will buy the items needed for the Family Promise Center Pantry and snacks for the evenings during the Host week. The Coordinator will provide the list.

<u>Setup and Breakdown</u>: SETUP: The host and guest rooms are set up on Sunday at the beginning of the Host Week (immediately after Sunday Worship). BREAKDOWN: The rooms are broken down and returned to normal usage beginning at 7am the following Sunday.

<u>Cooks</u>: The cook(s) will typically prepare a dinner each night for 14 guests, 2 evening hosts and the evening driver. The meal can be prepared at home or at the Church building. Dinner is served at 6pm. Cooks are needed Sunday through Saturday.

<u>Driver</u>: MORNINGS: The driver will pick up the families at the Church at 5:30am then drive them to the Family Promise Day Center at 206 Ellis Ave. In Glassboro

Need drivers Monday morning through Sunday morning EVENINGS: The driver will pick up the families at the Family Promise Day Center at 5:30pm then drive them to the Church Need drivers Sunday evening through Saturday evening. VAN TRANSFER: After worship services on the 2nd Sunday, one driver will deliver the van to the next congregation. The 2nd driver will follow to

bring the van driver back to his vehicle.

Evening Hosts: Two evening hosts are needed for each night. The Evening Hosts arrive around 5:30pm and will dine with and interact with the guests. Activities can be games, movies, helping with homework and typical family activities. The Evening Hosts are usually done by 8:30pm

<u>Overnight Hosts</u>: Two Overnight Hosts are needed for each night. The Overnight Hosts arrive around 8:30pm but no later than 8:45pm. Overnight Hosts will continue to interact similar to Evening Hosts. Families should settle in no later than 10:30pm. Overnight Hosts will check all the doors and lock the glass doors at both ends of the Church Building. The Overnight Hosts leave after the families leave which is typically 5:30am M-F, 8:00am SA and 7:00am SU
